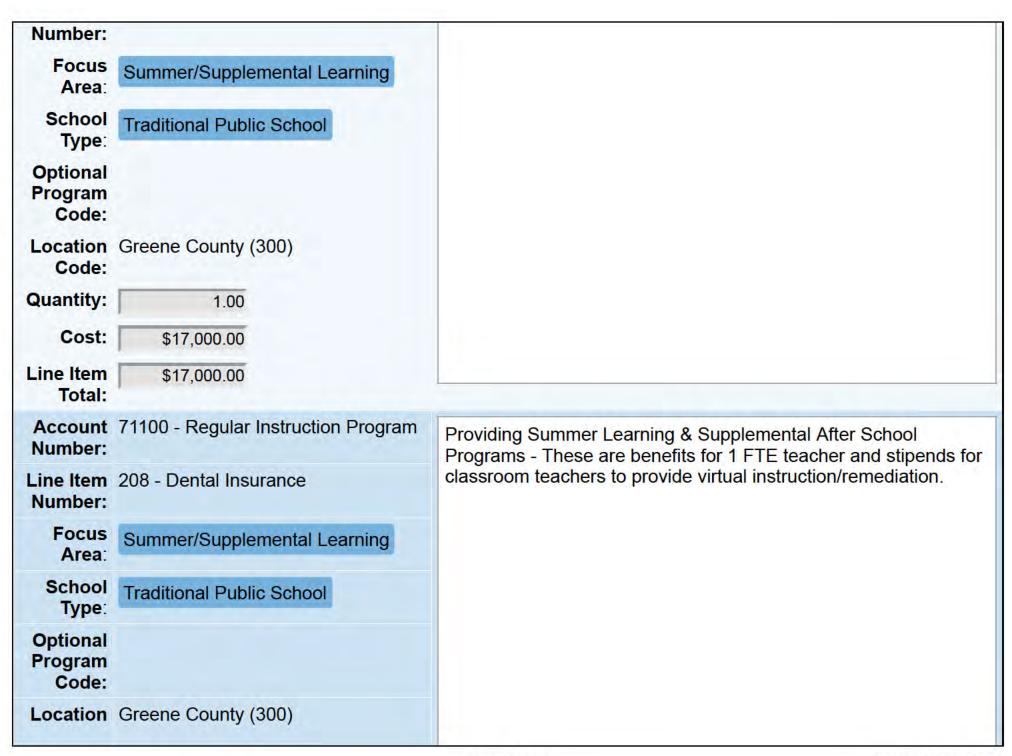

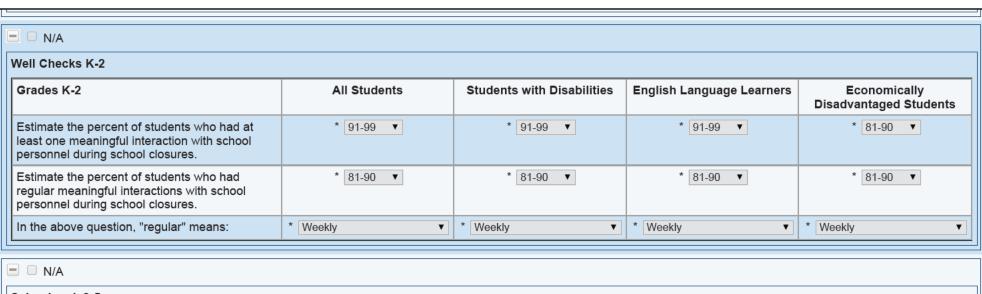

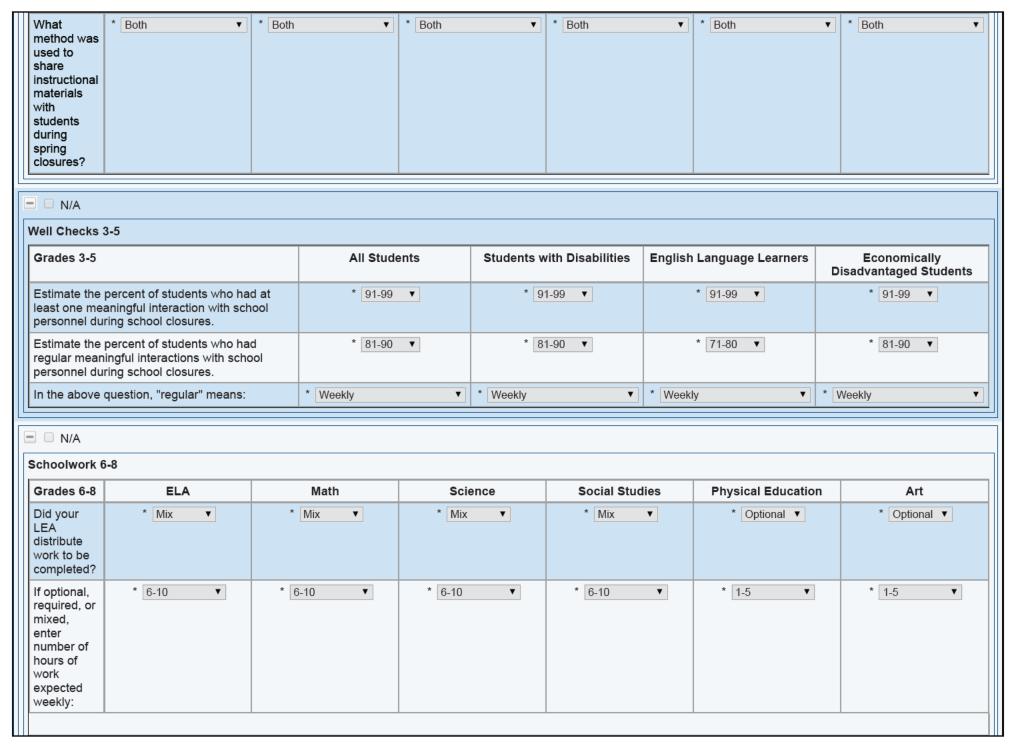

* What are the LEA's plans for measuring student progress given the data provided above?

Greene County plans to give grade level assessments to see where the students are upon return. These assessments will be designed in the grade level/content area PLCs during the summer. In addition to the teacher assessments, we will give the iReady assessment and the Start of Year Checkpoint at the beginning of school to determine learning deficits. Beyond that, the iReady assessment will be given three more times to help drive instruction.

* How does the LEA intend to address learning gaps resulting from the disruption of educational services? (CARES Act § 18003 (B))

The district has developed a multi-pronged approach to remediate and reduce learning gaps. The first approach is to have all teachers implement spiral review of the missing concepts. These reviews will be coordinated to deliver instruction and provide the remediation needed before key concepts are taught. The second approach is to reduce class sizes at the high school, in key content courses, by offering stipends to teachers. These stipends will entice teachers to teach four sections of a class instead of three sections, this will allow the class sizes to be smaller, and allow for more individualized instruction. The third approach is to offer greatly expanded content level tutoring after school. There will be transportation provided along with the tutoring. The final approach is to offer an expanded summer school offering. The summer school offerings will be geared toward content needs that are the result of the analysis of the progress monitoring assessments.

* Briefly describe how your district conducted checks on students (academically, non-academically/development/etc.). Include frequency of checks, number of students, and any other details.

If the teachers were not providing daily on-line instruction, they were instructed to provide weekly checks with the students. These checks could be through various methods: messaging, video meetings, video phone calls and in-person home visits using social distancing. During these checks, the teachers were instructed to not only check on academics, but to check for the well-being of the students. The teachers were also asked to keep documentation of their contacts with students. If a teacher was not able to establish regular contact with the student, the school counselor and the school administration would reach out to the parents to check on the academic progress and the well-being of the child. Even through all of these efforts, there were about 5 % to 7% of the students that were not reached on a regular weekly basis.

Planning

* Reflect on the challenges that the LEA faced during the COVID-19 pandemic. What prioritized needs did the LEA identify during the pandemic, and how do these needs relate to the selected focus area(s)?

The largest challenges for the district surrounded the lack of student devices and the lack of access to the internet. This lack of access led us to work with community resources to provide as much help as possible. Through the Niswonger Foundation, our district collaborated with the Dollar General corporation to have the free Wi-Fi at the Dollar General stores turned up to allow students to sit in the parking lots to have access to free internet. While this was not a perfect solution, it still allowed us to provide more access throughout the district. It is still a challenge for our students to receive internet access due to the lack of availability of internet and cell phone service in the remote sections of our county. We have begun the purchase of devices to bring us to one to one for grades 6 – 12. We are anticipating using ESSER funds to purchase enough devices to make grades 3 – 5 one to one as well.

Another challenge for us was the ability for parents to pick up the paper packets. While the paper packets were placed outside of each school in a protected location, some parents did not have transportation. In that event, where possible, the teachers and administrators would take the packets to the student's home. The district plans to use ESSER funds to have additional postage and travel funds available for the delivery of student packets.

The next challenge was the lack of cleaning supplies. The district has used leftover transportation funds to purchase extra cleaning supplies and masks for employees. The district plans to use ESSER funds to purchase additional cleaning supplies and health supplies for the monitoring of temperatures and to have masks available to the students

Timeline

Late June through July – Register students for virtual instruction path, in limited numbers through a strict screening process.

Late July/early August – Continued professional development with teachers on distance learning

August 1st — Orientation for students and parents taking the virtual instruction path; registration for students new to the district; all returning students who will attend buildings physically will have registered online

August 6th – Students will begin their first full day virtually and in-person with social distancing and health and safety protocols in place; Bus riders will be spaced apart to the best of our ability on the bus; an isolation area will be provided for students who are exhibiting signs of illness (i.e. fever); training for all custodial staff and additional cleaning routines will be implemented at each school site, including the addition of a 20 hour after-hours custodial staff member at every school; the instruction in proper hand washing and the use of hand sanitizer will be used with students and staff; signage will be added to all school entrances, hallways, and bathrooms to educate and encourage safe and healthy habits for reducing the spread of germs

Once school has resumed, we will continuously stay in contact with the local health department and monitor student attendance closely.

The goal is that the district is going to be 1:1 with student devices in all grades with devices. Teachers will maintain Canvas or Google Classroom, in the event a student is quarantined.

Budget & Spending Plan

The CARES funds are not intended to replace state/local funding but instead are intended to provide additional funding to address emergent needs resulting from COVID-19. With school closure decisions, districts likely had unanticipated budget surpluses (i.e. operations, transportation) that should be repurposed to support other expenditures arising from

COVID-19 (i.e. food services, paper, postage, etc.). The expectation for CARES funding is that it should be utilized primarily for re-opening and learning acceleration to address gaps resulting from school closure.

* In what areas has the LEA experienced significant budget-to-actual differences in state/local funds?

GCS has experienced some savings in the Transportation in the amount of \$65,000 diesel costs and Building operational lines of approx. \$175,000 in the heating/cooling expense area.

* How have these differences been repurposed to address related needs (i.e. custodial savings to sanitization costs, utilities and gas for buses (etc.) to nutrition).

We have used savings of approx. \$25,000 to purchase cleaning materials to sanitize our school buildings and the balance of \$215,000 to purchase materials for the upcoming fiscal year.

- GCS will have sufficient funds to cover school related costs for the remainder of this fiscal year despite the COVID situation. GCS will closely monitor budget expenditures for any deficits in the cleaning needs and additional devices to ensure all students have the necessary tools for success.

After surveying parents, teachers, parents and students, we have developed areas of need. The big areas of need are as follows: 1. Need for technology devices for students - \$98,500. 2 the need for technology devices for teachers - \$12,200. 3. The need for internet access for students - \$28,500. , 4. The need for additional technology support for the extra devices - \$80,000, 5. The need for extra guidance counseling - \$72,864, 6. The need for an expanded online instructional platform - \$170,000. 7. The need for intensive remedial instruction after school and during the summer of 2021 -\$595,000 . 8. The need for distance learning professional development for teachers - \$25,000. 9. The need for expanded services for our special populations - \$100,000. 10. The need for extra custodial services and supplies \$241,265. 11. The need for extra medical supplies- \$10,000.

Because of these needs we have developed a prioritized budget to address these needs to allow us to respond adequately for the return of students to school in August of 2020 and to prepare for an unexpected need to for extended school closure.

The plan is to purchase 5 teacher devices(\$2,000). This will allow all of our teachers to have a replacement device, in case their current device were to become unusable. In addition, the district set aside funds to replace up to 8 student devices (\$2,000). This should allow for grades 3 – 12 to maintain 1:1 in devices. In order to support the large number of extra devices it will be necessary to hire an additional technician to support the devices (\$43,321.00). The plan is for the district to find funding in FY 2024 to assume the cost of this technician. The success of these activities will be measured using: iReady Data, TNReady Data, parent surveys and teacher surveys.

2. Providing Summer Learning and Supplemental After School Programs (including online/distance learning)

These funds will be used to provide materials for after-school tutoring and distance learning. These funds will also be used to provide stipends/pay for teachers to provide online/distance learning. Additionally, the district has set aside \$50,000 for software to support student learning. The software planned to be purchased are: Kami - for student annotation of PDF files; ScreenCastify - for teachers to use with virtual instruction; Reflex and Frax Math - for math practice and Zearn for ELA instruction. The district has also set aside \$7,121.00 for bus drivers. The drivers will be used to transport students in after school tutoring and summer school. The effectiveness of these activities will be measured by the following: iReady, TNReady, EOC testing, parent surveys and student surveys.

3. Planning for Long-Term Closures

Within these funds we are adding custodial staffing at all school sites \$44,754. This is in response to the parent survey, where over 80% of the parents wanted to see more disinfecting of common areas of the schools. The success of these needs will be measured in three ways: iReady data, TN Ready Data and Parent surveys after the shutdown.

4. Addressing the Unique Needs of Special Populations

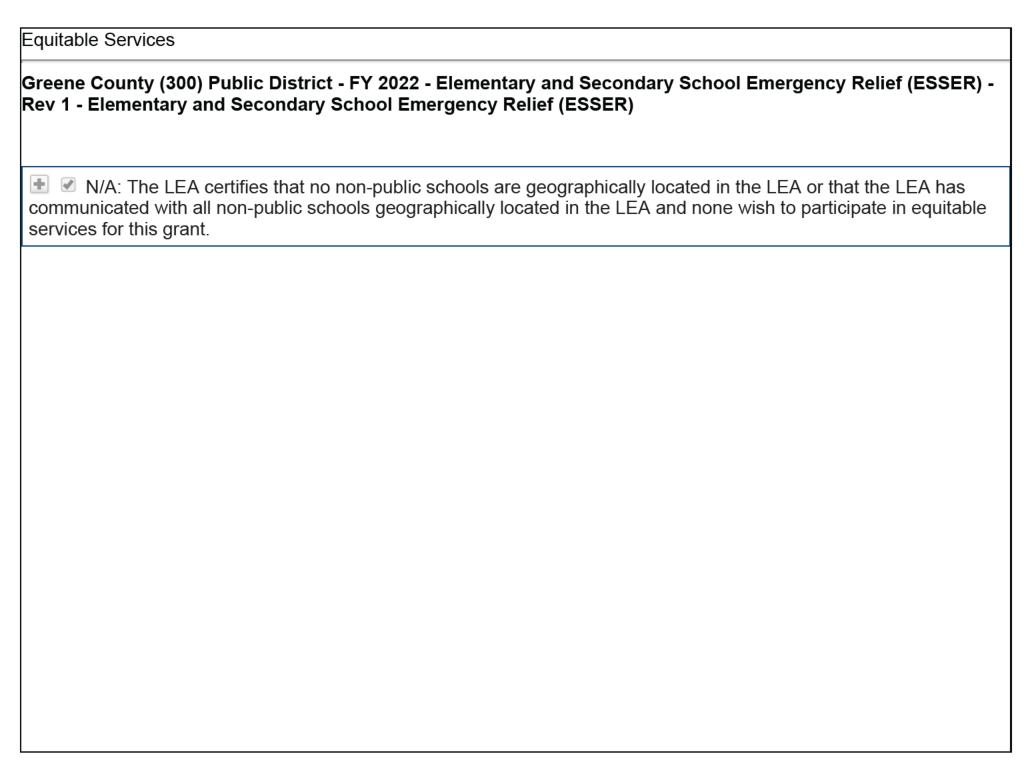

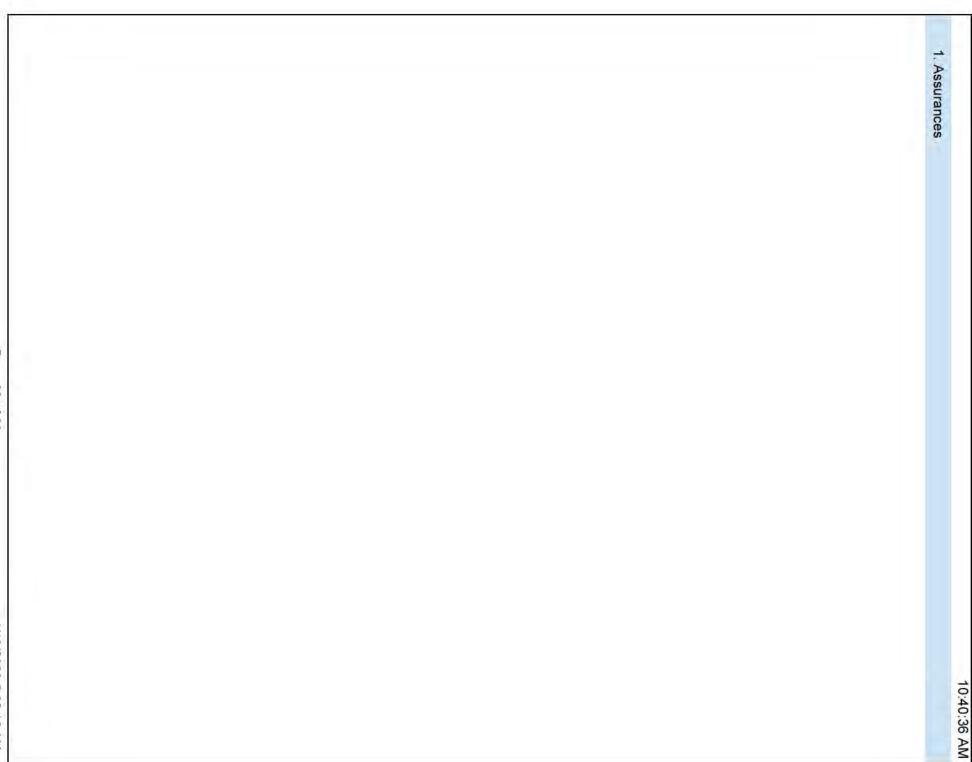

The district will use the funds to provide:

After School Tutoring - \$700,000 - this will provide for 100 tutors for the next three years to improve academic results

Summer School - \$900,000 to be braided with state and Save The Children funds to provide a robust summer program.

Instructional Supplies - \$757,890.93 - These funds will be used to provide supplies and materials for remediation, tutoring, and summer school. Possible materials to be purchased include but are not limited to: calculators, paper, composition books, physical education supplies, music classroom supplies, pencils, workbooks, etc. These funds will also be used to purchase the CASE Assessment for two years to measure student growth.

RTI Intervention Assistants - \$1,125,000 - to fund 19 assistants to lower ratios in RTI

Software - \$500,000 - to buy software such as: Kami, Canvas, Impero, Content Keeper, Amplify, Classlink,Reflex Math, Generation Genius, ScreenCastify, Insync, ABC Mouse, ACT Work Keys study software, and Amplify Reading

In-Service/Staff Development - 75,000 - Professional Development for new programs: Amplify, CASE, ACT WorkKeys, etc. These trainings will impact approximately 500 staff members.

\$53,000 - Transportation for Tutoring and Summer School

All of these will be measured with CASE Assessments, iReady Assessments, TNReady scores, CTE concentrator rates, and system growth.

2. Addressing Learning Acceleration: Summer, Supplemental After School, and Tutoring

4,800,000 - Replace HVAC units at four schools (McDonald, Glenwood, Baileyton and NGMS - the HVAC units at these schools are 21 years old and are too large for the classrooms. As a result, the HVAC units do not run for very long and result in poor air quality. They will be replaced with appropriate size units with CO2 sensors that will improve air quality.)

Replace roof HVAC units at four schools (Doak, Mosheim, Chuckey and Nolachuckey)- The roof units at these schools are 20 years old. In addition to replacing these units, the funds will be used to correct an HVAC issue in the inner cores of Doak and Mosheim. At these two schools the inner 12 classrooms are controlled by one thermostat and one roof unit. The one unit will be replaced with individual room units, this will improve air quality in these rooms and allow each room to have access to fresh air.

Install Central HVAC systems in 11 school gyms.(Baileyton, Camp Creek, Chuckey, Doak, Glenwood, McDonald, Mosheim, Chuckey-Doak Middle School, North Greene Middle School, and West Greene Middle School) - These school gyms are currently heated with fan forced heat units and are cooled with exhaust fans. During the late spring and late summer months the inside temperatures in the gyms often reaches the high 90's each day, in the winter the gyms only have fresh air int he gym, when the doors are opened. This will allow each gym to have better regulated air flow and will have CO2 sensors that will bring fresh air into the gym when the levels get too high.

1,500,000 for an eight classroom addition at Chuckey-Doak Middle School. This school currently has four classrooms in mobile units. The mobile units are 20 plus years old, plus are very small. In addition the school utilizes an older block building to house five programs in a very small area. This addition will provide larger classrooms to allow the students to have more classroom space. These funds will be used in combination with system Capital Outlay funds to complete the construction.

The effectiveness of these activities will be measured by student attendance rates at these schools.

4. Purchasing Education Technology (including hardware, software, and connectivity)

These funds will be used to purchase and replace student computers for the next three years - \$1,676,000.00 The vendor will be determined by the middign process. The approximate cost of each device will be \$300.00 The funds will also be used to purchase classroom display panels, this should ensure that all instructional areas have a display panel - \$140,000.00. The current vendor is Viewsonic, but the vendor will be determined in the bidding process. The approximate cost is \$2,000 per device.

\$340,000 - This will provide funds to replace teacher devices for the next three years. This will purchase approximately 425 devices. The current vendor is Dell, but that will be determined based on future bids.

\$45,000 – Technician salary and benefits

These effectiveness of these activities will be measured with parent and teacher surveys, TNReady Scores and System Growth.

All of these will be measured with CASE Assessments, iReady Assessments, TNReady scores, CTE concentrator rates, and system growth.

The district currently has three different curriculums in use for the grade spans of K-5, 6-8 and 9-12. As a result there is a lack of continuity of terminology and instruction. In addition, the current curriculums are not complete, thus forcing teachers to search for materials to fill the gaps, again creating a lack of continuity of teaching methods. It has been discovered that the currently adopted curriculum for the highs chool grades is so inadequate that the teachers have stopped using it and are using the textbooks that were adopted 15 years ago.

The goal is to use these funds to purchase a high quality mathematics program for all grade spans. This should create continuity of terminology, math methods and improve test scores in the middle and high school grades. Our data has shown that the elementary grade scores have improved in relation to state averages, our middle and high

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school grades have not improved.

This activity will be measured with CASE Assessments, iReady Assessments, TNReady scores, and system growth.

9. High Quality Instructional Materials for Early Literacy

The district will be using these funds for the implementation of TN early literacy foundational skills. The materials will include but not be limited to: workbooks, classroom materials, and composition books, etc.

This activity will be measured with CASE Assessments, iReady Assessments, TNReady scores, and system growth.

10. Public Health Coordination and Protocols

The district will use these funds to hire 16 extra COVID custodians that will work four hours each night to provide extra, deep cleaning in the classrooms. In addition, there will be funds available to purchase custodial supplies for cleaning the classrooms. The effectiveness will be measured through surveys of stakeholders, attendance rates and infection rates.

Having to travel off-site creates more instructional time lost for students, lending to additional learning loss and gaps. Items to be purchased include but are not limited to: welding gloves, welding curtains, tools, drafting supplies, Family and Consumer science supplies, Legos, etc.

CTE Equipment - These funds will be used to purchase needed CTE equipment: computers, 3-D printers, saws, drills, welders, band saws, etc. This will address the needs from lost learning during the pandemic. These supplies will give more supports and additional opportunities for students to gain industry certifications to be ready graduates. These additional items will also reduce the need for students to travel to the off-site technical school to gain industry certifications. Having to travel off-site creates more instructional time lost for students, lending to additional learning loss and gaps.

The district will have a part-time data collection analyst to collect and report data on students impacted by ESSER 3.0 funds. This person will also report the data to the ESSER website and to the academic coaches and supervisors. The FTE for this person will be 0.6 The total cost over three years - \$91,250.00

The funds will also support stipends for the extra duties for the bookkeepers to review expenditures, request reimbursements, track funds and track equipment. There are 7 individuals working on this with a combined FTE of 0.35). The total cost over three years - \$96,200.00

The funds will also be used to pay the ESSER supervisor a stipend for extra duties related to directing the grant. The FTE of this person is 0.05. The total cost over three years will be \$14,050.00

In addition to the above, we have set aside \$10,000 for travel related to management of the grant.

Finally, we have set aside \$28,000 for office supplies and materials related to the grant administration. Items to include - computer for tracking data, printer for data analysis, paper, folders, binders, pens, etc.

Planning

Reflect on the challenges that the LEA faced during the COVID-19 pandemic. What prioritized needs did the LEA identify during the pandemic?

In Academics, we faced challenges with in-person instruction, as we had 52 or more virtual days. As a result of this, the academic progress of the student suffered. The other academic challenges were the number of students that faced quarantine throughout the year. The spring TNReady scores indicated that we had indeed lost ground with the students. As a result, we have prioritized improving RTI through adding RTI assistants at all schools. We have also made it a priority to improve access to tutoring, but offering low ratio high intensity tutoring and to continue summer school.

In Student Readiness, we faced challenges surrounding having enough access to CTE equipment. In addition, the number of virtual instruction days, impacted our graduation rate. One area that seemed to suffer was dual credit participation and AP participation. Our district utilized earlier CARES Act funds to address the mental health aspect of students, these efforts were picked up by the general-purpose budget this school year. Our district had chosen to add nurses the previous year, so, while it was a challenging year for our nursing staff, they were able to care for the students very well. As a result of these challenges, we decided to use funds to address the CTE supply and equipment needs to allow more students to participate in classes. Additionally, we plan to use funds to increase participation in dual credit and AP courses.

In the areas of Educators, we did not have significant staff shortages, but we did have several staff quarantines. We have been able to start the year fully staffed. We used earlier ESSER funds to provide stipends for extra duties and time from March 2020, through April 2021. This seemed to have kept the teacher morale up and the attendance remained strong. We are however, facing shortages, in hard to staff areas of Special Education and High school math and science. This is why we are using funds to support hiring assistants participating in the Grow Your Own Program.

In foundational areas, we have faced challenges to keep enough quality devices for the students to be 1:1. We were able to get through last year using old devices, however we will need to continue the process of replacing computers. We initially had a challenge with students having access to high speed internet. We started the year with 26% with no internet, by the end of the year only 2% of the students were without internet. Our district is still participating in the T-Mobile partnership to provide internet to those families. Our largest constraint in facilities is the air quality and space. The HVAC at some of our schools is very old and do not allow for great air quality. We want to improve that by upgrading the HVAC at several schools. Additionally, one of our schools has four old small classrooms in mobile units. We want to improve that by adding classroom space at that school.

We currently use iReady for progress monitoring, but it only monitors ELA and Math. We are using ESSER 2.0 funds to purchase CASE assessments for this year. It will assess all subject areas. Our intention is to use ESSER 3.0 funds to purchase CASE for 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 if it is giving us great feedback for this school year. In the interim, we will continue to use iReady and CASE to monitor student growth.

To address learning loss, we plan to implement more low ratio, high intensity tutoring across the district. The plan is to use ESSER 3.0 funds to purchase a program Amplify Reading for grades K-5 and Reading Plus for grades 6 – 12, Math for K-5 will be Do the Math, 6 – 8 will be Mathia, 9 – 12 will be Determined based on the content needs these will be used exclusively with tutoring. The rationale for the new programs is to provide something different than what is seen during the day. The CASE assessments will determine if the programs are effective. In addition, we will be adding RTI Assistants to lower the ratios to improve remediation during the day.

Oversight Plan

The district is planning to hire a retired teacher that specialized in student data to help with data monitoring. She will be collecting student data for growth, attendance, and will be responsible with posting that information to the district's ESSER website. She will also be tasked to report the data to the TDOE. In addition to her work, the district's data team will be conducting monthly reviews of the data to determine if the supports are effective or need to be adjusted.

On the fiscal side, we are equipping our finance department for the increased fiscal monitoring needed for this grant. The district will still continue to adhere to EDGAR rules and internal spending controls. The district will also be

adding \$500,000 in temporary funds to the Federal fund balance to allow for more flexibility in paying for ESSER items for reimbursement. In addition to the safeguards, the district has hired an additional clerk that is responsible to for tracking the ESSER Inventory and with monitoring purchases. The ESSER director along with the district's budget director will conduct monthly audits of ESSER expenditures to ensure compliance with all spending requirements.

We will expand our stakeholder plan to include surveys to students and to seek input from the high school student advisory council. We will continue to have surveys periodically to get feedback on perceived progress from the community. If there is an underrepresented group, we will seek out advocates for those groups to seek feedback as well.

The district utilized a large stake holder meeting that attempted to draw in as many people from the cross-section families. The turnout was excellent and their ideas were collected to give the district a framework to go by in developing the plan. In addition to seeking that input, the local education association completed a survey and those results were reviewed and considered. Then the district did a public survey that was shared through email, on social media and the district website to collect feedback on the proposals. Finally, a school board workshop was held to discuss those proposals along with feedback. Using the feedback from all of those groups, the district has developed a plan that is being sent to the school board for approval.

Planning for the Use and Coordination of ARP ESSER Funds

The district continues to use the ESSER 1 and 2 funds consistent with their original intents. Their use will be monitored along with the ESSER 3.0 funds. In all of these funds, the intent is to respond to the safe re-opening of schools during and after the COVID pandemic. The majority of the focus has been on improving academics and improving the quality of the learning environment through cleaning and providing better air quality. That is the continued focus of the use of these funds, we need to refine and improve tutoring and improve data monitoring. The funds are allowing us to move in that direction.

The district has set aside funds to be focused on these special populations, to ensure they receive extra support for academic remediation. But in reality, since our district has 34% ED rate and 25% SWD rate, we will be using the

funds set aside for remediation to address their needs as well. The students in these subgroups will be monitored to ensure they have equitable access to the tutoring being offered and will have priority for the summer school program.

- 3. The LEA must track in their standard accounting program ESSER 3.0 funds separately from ESSER 1.0 and 2.0 funds.
- 4.
